From Rabbi Ken

On May 3rd, at our Friday night service, we expressed our gratitude to all of our SULAM teachers. In

particular, we appreciated Sarit Ferreira, who is leaving TCS, and who has made such an impact in her two years as Education Director.

As I thought about working with Sarit, one Jewish teaching especially jumped out at me. It comes from a section of the Talmud called Pirkei Avot, a collection of ethical teachings that Jews traditionally study during the Omer, the period between Passover and Shavuot.

"Shammai said: "Make your study of Torah a fixed habit; say little and do much; and receive every person with a cheerful countenance." See how well it fits her! Sarit has pushed us to "make our study of Torah a fixed habit" by encouraging us to integrate it into our families' lives through many different creative techniques, especially during our transition to Zoom. Sarit exemplifies "say little and do much:" she actually does not like being the center of attention or public speaking, and she

probably was not happy that we talked about her that night (or that I'm writing this article!). But her innumerable actions speak loudly for her.

One of the reasons I have enjoyed working with Sarit is her complete commitment to our programs' success. She will do anything to help, designing, drawing, shopping, schlepping. She may try to keep some boundaries, but she says yes for more than she says no. She may prefer to say little, but she does much.

And finally, everyone who knows Sarit knows that she does "receive every person with a cheerful countenance," making them feel welcome, valuable, and an important part of our congregational family. She lives out Pirkei Avot, modeling Jewish learning and living in her actions as well as her words. Personally, I will miss Sarit very much. I have loved working with her, and I am delighted to call her my colleague and my friend. Our ntire TCS community owes her our gratitude and our appreciation.


